Course Description

Prerequisite: Students must sign a form stating that they are at least 18 years old, have a minimum education of a high school or general equivalency diploma, and they have experience working as a certified nurse aide for a least six months. Students can not have any abuse notations against them at the Nurse Aide Registry.

They must also provide a copy of the current CNA card in LTC issued by the Oklahoma State Department of Health, and drivers license.

The state of Oklahoma requires that persons administering medications in nursing/health facilities must be certified or licensed. This program prepares you to become certified in this area. Learn to administer medications and how medications affect the systems of the body.

Course Objectives

Administer Medication

- Document medication schedules and administration
- Apply proper medication storage procedures
- Identify five purposes of medications
- Prepare and administer medications
- Recognize appropriate situations requiring assistance of supervisor
- Use medical terminology, symbols, and abbreviations
- Utilize the seven Rights of Medication Administration
- Apply knowledge of controlled drug procedures
- Distinguish errors in drug medication administration
- Utilize drug reference sources
- Relate vital sign measurement with drug administration
- Recognize appropriate medication labeling

Observe, Report, and document Client Status

- Demonstrate correct blood pressure measurement and documentation on the medication administration record
- Apply knowledge of drug administration in relation to client status
- Apply basic concepts of drug/drug interactions, drug/food interactions, and medication timed to coincide with meals

Comply with Legal and Ethical Guidelines

- Apply procedures to report abuse, neglect, and misappropriation of resident's property/funds
- Apply practices for confidentiality and privacy
- Utilize institution/agency policies
- Apply policies and procedures in relation to job performance and role in institutional setting
